Kids Hope USA is a national, nonprofit organization that was founded in

1995 for the purpose of addressing the needs of elementary age children who could benefit from a one-on-one mentoring relationship with a caring and consistent adult. Today, Kids Hope USA supports almost 1,000 church-school partnerships across 34 states. One local church partners with one local elementary school and recruits volunteer mentors and prayer partners through an appointed director. Each mentor is paired with a prayer partner who covers the



student, mentor, and whole program in prayer. When KH Director Mary Wilson asked me



(Armineh Manookian) to become a mentor to a first grade student 10 years ago, little did I know the path God had planned for us. Though the road was often bumpy, it always allowed me to meet Him in new ways. While I was focused on "guiding" and "helping," God was teaching me to abide with my student-to be with her and love her at that very moment, no matter what the moment looked

As a teacher (a.k.a. Mrs. Roach), my favorite moments were working in small groups or having one on one conversations with students. It was an opportunity to "listen" and "learn" together. Kids Hope had been flourishing under Mary Wilson's guidance for five years when I retired. I could not wait to give mentoring a try. Now eight years later, I don't regret a single moment. Being a part of Kids Hope, as a mentor or prayer partner, brings joy, fear, laughter, tears, energy, and exhaustion...isn't that what life is all about?

We all know, "Children are a gift from the Lord. They are a reward from Him." (Psalm 127:3) Whether it be our own child, grandchild, niece, nephew, neighbor, or a child walking down the street...each is a gift! Jump in, give it a try, get to know one of God's gifts! You won't regret it. You will receive much more than you give.

PASTOR'S LETTER

Greetings La Crescenta Presbyterian Church Family & Friends –

I hope and pray you are having a wonderful summer! Mine has been a busy one yet a very fruitful summer as well. One of many tensions in the Christian life has to do with the concept of time. On the one hand, we are required to exhibit urgency. "Redeeming the time, because the days are evil," says the Apostle Paul in Ephesians 5:16. James portrays life as a vapor, which appears and suddenly vanishes away. In Psalm 39:5, the Psalmist says our lives are a "mere breath." We must always keep in mind that our time is short. British missionary Charles T. Studd (1860-1931 AD) penned a short poem with this constant refrain: Only one life, 'twill soon be past ... Only what's done for Christ will last.

On the other hand, we are responsible to plan for the future, consider the big picture, and do our best to set up the coming generations for spiritual success. We cannot be so absorbed with present issues that we ignore prudent long-term preparation. Yes, Jesus could return today, but He also might tarry another hundred years. We earnestly anticipate the former, and intentionally plan for the latter. As your Senior Pastor & Head of Staff, and having spent a full year serving LCPC, I just started drafting my vision for the next phase of LCPC's ministry and mission. You will hear more about this vision in the next 4-6 months as it's being finalized. It's on my heart to make sure that LCPC not only survives but thrives; not only go deep but also go wide.

As I start my second year serving LCPC, I'm reminded of this tension in our life as a church. We desperately want to make an impact. Play is so important here at CFC. We know kids are learning all the time when they are playing. Here is an article that talks about that.

Just as children need to eat more than one type of vegetables to be healthy, they need many types of play as well. Different vegetables offer different nutritional profiles that contribute to good health, and different types of play make unique contributions to healthy development. Sometimes play is loud and big -- chasing, giggling, cries of delight. Play can also be quiet and still -whispers, snuggling into pillows, and looking at pictures in a book. Sometimes play is child-led. Children show autonomy, decision-making, and inventiveness. Play can also be guided by others -- responsive, scaffolded, and supported to help them practice new skills in a playful way. Sometimes play is creative -- building block structures, painting masterpieces, sculpting playdough. Play can also be appropriately destructive -- toppling towers, tearing paper, smashing dough. Sometimes play means engaging with lots of other children -- games of tag, playing house, building forts. Play can also be solitary -carefully examining a new discovery, moving tiny pieces, constructing an imaginary world for one. You'll see play in many different areas and in many different forms in our classroom. They look and sound different, but they are all valuable.
