PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear LCPC Family,

I hope and pray this finds you all in the fullness of God's blessings and grace. Community! Community has become an important word for me lately. Building a Christ-centered community is a dream that I've for our congregation; a future that I am envisioning for LCPC. A Christ-centered community is a vision that I deeply carry in my heart every day.

As a congregation, we know the importance of building and fostering a Christ-centered community right here at La Crescenta Presbyterian Church. This is why we dedicated our Fall PEAK Semester this year to reflect on community and learn together how to build a community in Christ. For 10 weeks, we will dig deep, wrestle together, and revisit our understanding of community.

What is a Christ-Centered Community?

A Christ-centered community is a diverse, dynamic network where Jesus Christ is at the center of everything. That community will guide individuals to grow in faith, support one another, and reflect God's love in word and action. A Christ-centered community, therefore, fosters genuine, transformative relationships, which is extremely essential to the Christian faith, and serve as a witness to the world.

In today's world, where loneliness, division, and superficial connections are rampant, the need for authentic, Christ-centered communities has never been greater. Unlike communities formed around common interests or proximity, a Christ-centered community centers on shared Christian values, which drive its members toward a common mission of love, grace, and service.

Biblical and Theological Foundation

Community is beautiful. "Look, how good and how pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" Psalm 133:1. Community is God's vision for His people, for the Church. Community is on God's heart. God is community. God exists as a divine community (the Trinity), and living in loving community reflects this divine nature. God created people to live together, not alone, and to experience life joyfully alongside one another, beginning in the Garden of Eden. Living in community is a creation mandate.

Following Jesus' example, we would embrace, work hard together to cultivate and build a community. Jesus Himself lived this out by forming a community of 12 friends and disciples, and His command was to love one another, a principle that is lived out in community. The book of Acts shows the powerful communal life of the early Church, characterized by prayer, teaching, fellowship, and support for one another.

Core Principles of a Christ-Centered Community

- Jesus as the Foundation: The community begins with the non-negotiable truth that Jesus is the cornerstone. Its mission and priorities are shaped by His teachings rather than personal agendas.
- Unity through Christ: A Christ-centered community is marked by a deep sense of unity that transcends members' racial and linguistic differences, political affiliation, economic status, etc. This unity is formed through a shared identity and purpose in Christ.

• Authentic Relationships: Relationships are built on honesty, vulnerability, and mutual support, not superficial interactions.



Members feel safe to share their struggles and victories, extending grace to one another

- Commitment to Spiritual Growth: This is a place where members are challenged to grow deeper in their faith. It involves regular worship, prayer, Bible study, and holding one another accountable.
- A Culture of Service: Following Jesus's example, the community prioritizes serving others with humility, both within the group and in the wider world.
- Grace and Forgiveness: Healthy communities face conflicts with humility and a focus on reconciliation, speaking the truth in love. Forgiveness is readily sought and extended, reflecting Christ's forgiveness.
- Intentionality: Building a Christ-centered community requires conscious effort, grace, and a shared commitment to living out the gospel.

LCPC, let's do it. It's awesome to engage in building such a community. If you are not already part of our PEAK class this semester, "Building a Community in Christ", it's not too late to join us every Wednesday. "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves" Romans 12:10.



Dear LCPC,

I write to you with a joyful heart, especially following the delightful visit Daniel and I had with you back in February. We loved introducing our children to the wonderful community at LCPC, and wearing t-shirts and shorts in winter was nice too! Thank you for your hospitality and continued care for our family and my ministry with InterVarsity, helping college students in Boston experience Jesus during their years in college before being sent to serve God in their places of work, communities, and churches.

This fall semester has begun with excitement already coming. Three quick glimpses:

- At Boston College, 70 students attended their first large group, and half were freshmen! 20 freshmen are coming to the freshmen Bible study there!
- At Berklee College of Music's first worship and prayer night, 35 students attended, and 17 were freshman or new to InterVarsity.

 At MIT (Massachusetts Institute of Technology), several freshman athletes came out to the first events, some Christian, and others open to faith conversations!

Pray with us for these new students to grasp hold of God and community in college.

Pray also toward one of our aims this year: for every InterVarsity student leader in Boston

to invite 5 non-Christians to an IV event (Bible study, worship night, or weekend retreat). Pray for courage for each student leader to invite, and for many students to accept the invitation. I also want to include a note of encouragement for you too: can you imagine what might happen if each person in LCPC

made five invitations to people around you to experience Jesus and community in a Bible study, prayer night, or Sunday church service this year?


This month: we received our new wineskins (a significant work God did among our team last year) and felt exhorted to be willing to stretch beyond what we have previously found comfortable, knowing our new wineskins can hold. For me personally, that struck when I thought about my own sleep and early morning time with God. Following many years of young kids in the house needing help throughout the night, every minute of sleep is precious. Daniel and I adjusted to early bedtimes as a staple for us! Being stretched in sacrificing some of my sleep was confirmed again in another time of

prayer with church friends, so I began setting an alarm to wake up before Abigail (our earliest riser in the house) wakes up, so I can read a psalm and pray for the day ahead. These early morning moments have been transformative for me. I'm thankful for how it felt like God gently invited me back into this old rhythm of mine.
