mittee, discussed the time we spent with the candidates, and prayed over them. We had a

on our Pastor Nominating Committee and where we currently stand. We begin each meeting with prayer followed by scripture readings, mostly on a particular topic, while at other times we are tasked to bring a favorite scripture or one that is speaking to us at the moment. Once the business of the meeting is concluded we end in prayer — for our committee, other committees and individuals as we are led, and always for the pastor God has already selected and called for our church.

To this end, our committee has reviewed around 100 Pastor Information Forms, or PIFs, and we have interviewed dozens of candidates, some two and three times. We arrived at a short list and held neutral pulpit weekends for three pastors. These weekends included Friday dinners and Saturday lunches attended by the pastor, their spouse, and several PNC members. Each couple were given a tour of the church campus. The weekend culminated with the PNC hearing the pastor preach in a neutral pulpit followed by lunch together.

After each of these weekends, we met as a com-

strong sense of call for one in particular and in unity, invited them, pastor and spouse, to consider a call to pastor our church. They spent a week in prayerful consideration looking for discernment regarding the call. In the end the pastor informed us that they did not feel "pulled" to our church, to use their term.

We spent time over the intervening weeks processing our disappointment in this outcome while discussing and pursuing our next steps, which are to continue to evaluate and consider candidates and pray that the Holy Spirit guide us, give us discernment, and show us who God is calling as our next pastor.

In spite of what we view as a setback, we are hopeful and we believe that the Holy Spirit has accomplished and will accomplish His purpose through this process.

We are deeply appreciative of your love and support and we covet your prayers.

Last summer, Matteen (name changed), an incoming freshman at UMass Boston, messaged the UMass Boston InterVarsity chapter on Instagram. He shared, "I'm an Afghani international student from Iran looking for housing since the dorms don't have any space left. Could you help me?" Shawn, our UMass Boston staff, reached out to local church partners hoping someone might have a room to offer. One member from a congregation offered to house Matteen! When the semester began, Shawn invited Matteen to Bible study at UMass Boston. Matteen shared he was Muslim, yet also curious about Christianity. He especially wanted to learn about Jesus. Matteen began to attend church with the family who is hosting him. That church also connected Matteen to an Iranian missionary who shared his own story of coming to faith in Jesus. Matteen continues to participate in the InterVarsity Bible study on campus. Pray for Matteen's journey with Jesus. Pray also for his future as he hopes to return to Iran after college.

Praise: Thank you for praying for Fall Conference! We hosted 200 students and maxed out the conference space! Students were inspired with the conference theme of the "Abundance of God." Together we studied various Bible passages: manna in the desert, Jesus' miracle of feeding 5,000+, and Paul's beautiful prayer for the church in Ephesians 3.

Looking to the Future: This is a special time of year when students begin to see InterVar




