## PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear La Crescenta Presbyterian Church Family & Friends,

On the last day of March, we celebrated the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ – the wonderful and world-altering event that matters as much today as it did 2,000 years ago. The resurrection of Christ is a central doctrine of Christianity. The accounts of the resurrection of Jesus are found in the four gospels – Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John – and various theological expressions of the early church's universal conviction and consensus that Christ rose from the dead are found throughout the rest of the New Testament.

The apostle Paul, for example, considered the resurrection to be the cornerstone of the Christian faith, if Jesus did not rise from the dead, the whole structure, Christianity, collapses, Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 15:14-17. The Christian faith and its claim to be truth exist only if Jesus rose from the dead.

The resurrection of Christ is for sure the pivotal movement for Christianity and the importance of this belief cannot be overstated.

The doctrine of the bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ after his death at Calvary is not an option for Christians. It is not an appendix to the gospel. It lies at the core of Christianity. Without it, Christianity would have been still-born, for a living faith cannot survive a dead Savior. Hence, against certain heretics in the early church who appear to have somehow "spiritualized" the resurrection, Paul insisted that "if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain" (1 Cor. 15:14).

The heart of Christianity is a living Christ! Easter comes to remind us in a way like no other that we believe in a God who is alive, active and present in all the ups and downs of life; a God who works behind the scenes. Easter is about God's power working behind the scenes. I think one of our frustrations and disappointments as followers of Jesus is that we don't always perceive the ways of God. We don't always understand how God works in the world and in our lives to accomplish His purposes.

So when you find yourself between a rock and a hard place, trust God. When facing situ-

ing hearts through their acts of service and commitment.

With MAZ behind us, I am eager to see what God has planned for Abide and our continued ministry together. There is a sense of excitement in the air as we



await the unfolding of His divine plan, and I am confident that He will lead us into new and fruitful endeavors.

In closing, I am grateful for the opportunity to serve alongside such dedicated individuals and to witness the miraculous ways in which God is working in our midst. May we continue to press forward with faith and expectancy, trusting in His guidance and provision every step of the way.



# Director's Corner

At the beginning of this month I will be off to Pennsylvania to see the total eclipse of the sun. The next total solar eclipse in the United States will be in 2044, only North Dakota and Montana and then in 2045 from California to Florida. I was fortunate to see the last total eclipse in 2017 in South Carolina. It was an experience beyond words, but I will try.

We pulled into our reserved parking place on the campus of Clemson University, right along Lake Hartwell. To say the scene was like a football tailgate would be the best way to describe the atmosphere. Then it started to happen, we could see the sun start to disappear. At first there was a cheer, but then as it got darker and darker the crowd got quieter and a hush happened among the 4000+ people gathered along the shoreline.

If you have been to the south then you know the sound of the cicadas in the trees. It is very loud, in what seemed like an instant there was no more sound from these large insects. No birds singing just utter silence for the just over three minutes the sky was black.

As the sun began to appear, there was still awe from the crowd and when it finally was at full capacity again, another cheer went up, I reached out and hugged my daughter and brother who had traveled cross country to that we could be together for the totality. It was about the most spiritual moment I have ever had outside of a church. There is this feeling that as much as we try to be in control, there is this natural phenomenon that we have no control over.

It is no wonder that for centuries this seemingly unpredictable occurrence, this legend handed down through generations of when the sky went black, brought thoughts of curses or punishment from a god. I knew the sun was coming back in a few minutes, but what terror there must have been when the sun was "removed" from the sky and wondering if it was going to come back!

So how am I going to tie this into Early Childhood Education or your child's development? Think about those times we leave children, especially in a new place or with new people for the first time. Without experience, the young child could wonder, will I ever see my parents again? This doesn't mean that we avoid those situations because again, experience is the best teacher, they will begin to trust that you will return.

So much of life is now explainable, but children don't always get that explanation before something happens. This is why at around age 2-3, that Christmas seems to have more wonder for them. They don't remember that plugging in a strand of lights makes the whole outside of the house light up. The excitement of fireworks or the terror of them takes time to get used to.

As adults we think of first times with children, but really they can experience the first time of something many times, each time with a new understanding. So enjoy these first times,
