For Christians, the issue is much deeper: We know that God created the world, and it belongs to Him, not us. Because of this, we are only stewards or trustees of God's creation, and we aren't to abuse or neglect it. The Bible says, "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it" (Psalm 24:1).


When we fail to see the world as God's creation, we will end up abusing it. Selfishness and greed take over, and we end up not caring about the environment or the problems we're creating for future generations."

At the March 28 Stated Meeting of Session, the following items were discussed and/or approved:

Director's Corner

How can it be May already? May is our last full month in the classes as we have known them and the last full month of the elementary school year. The time of making summer plans. It's a time of nice weather and growing spirits.

We will be spending more time outside enjoying all that God has provided. Some people see our time outside of the classroom as a break from learning, but outdoors is one of the best science classrooms you could find! In early childhood, science learning objectives center largely on life science, earth and space science, and physical science. Nature's curriculum for teaching these topics is embedded in every moment spent playing outside. Whether it's observing an ant make its way across the sidewalk, noticing the signs that go along with the changing seasons, or realizing the moon can sometimes be spotted during the daytime, children are constantly building their scientific knowledge base through their experiences outside.

With physical science concepts - like un-

derstanding properties of water and light or how objects move — outside is ideal! Big ideas, big questions, and big movements are guaranteed while playing outside. In outdoor play, children naturally balance, climb, jump, swing, toss, and race. Those activities not only help children explore physics concepts but also help them build their own large motor skills.

Perhaps most valuable, our time outside also provides restorative mental health benefits. Many studies have shown the benefits to mood, focus, and overall health provided by time outside in nature. Particularly in the context of a classroom, studies show that time spent playing outside helps increase focus, attention, and on-task behavior. Researchers explain that the ability to focus is not an infinite resource. As it is used, it becomes depleted. Interestingly, time in nature appears to restore that ability more efficiently than does rest alone.

It's fascinating that nature not only provides the subject matter but also primes our minds for learning. That's why outside is an ideal place to play! Hope you find time to be outside as a family this May,
